

CONNECTIONS

"I am the true vine and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit, he prunes to make it bear more fruit...I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. (John 15:1-2, 5)

The Presbyterian Church (USA) strives to be a connectional church. From Member to Congregation to Session to Presbytery to Synod to General Assembly our philosophy is to work together to proclaim the Kingdom of God locally, regionally, and globally. We also adhere to the motto, **"Ecclesia reformata, semper reformanda secundum verbum Dei,"** that is, "The church reformed, always to be reformed according to the Word of God" in the power of the Holy Spirit. (Book of Order F-2.02)

In order to grow and produce fruit, the branches of the vine must always be changing in response to our Lord who is a living God and continues to act in the world. In the structures of the church, this growth begins at the "bottom" and works its way "up." We, who are the branches of the local congregation, are the first point of contact with fellow Christians and with those who have yet to come to Christ.

On January 25, 2020 I finished my term as Moderator of the Presbytery of Florida. It has been a wonderful experience and I appreciate the support I have received from you that allowed me to serve in that position. One thing it reinforced in me is the connectional nature between the local congregation and the Presbytery. Sometimes that connection is difficult to detect, but our Presbytery is making great strides to offer more support and encouragement to individual congregations and our regional body as a whole. There are meaningful places to serve at the Presbytery level to help strengthen the connections and I urge each of you to consider participating in the ministry of Jesus Christ on that level.

As I think about First Presbyterian Church I am amazed at the width and depth of our connections. You will see in the Annual Report to be presented at the Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 2 about the ministry of the members and committees. Each time we participate in an event or activity of the church, we are connecting with one another and those beyond our walls. Again, I pray that each one of you will consider how you might contribute to the health of our ministry here in FWB.

I am proud of the work we do and the faithful living we model in our community. Could we do more? Of course! But our worship, Bible study, outreach, service, and fellowship keep us connected to the Lord Jesus Christ as we abide in him day after day.


